- Explicación gramatical.

Como pudiste observar el texto esta en pasado, ya que la historia sucedió en 1985. ¿Como nos damos cuenta?, los verbos están en pasado.

Recordá que hay dos tipos de verbos, los **regulares** y los **irregulares**.

A los verbos **regulares** le agregamos **-ed** para que estén en pasado, o solo **-d**, si el verbo termina con e.

Ej.: live-lived : Now, I live in Cipolletti (ahora vivo en cipolletti)

Five years ago, I lived in Nqn (hace 5 años, vivía en Nqn)

Y su forma negativa: I didn't live in Plotier (no viví en Plotier)

Start-start**ed**: Today, I start Reading a new book (hoy comienzo a leer un libro nuevo)

I start**ed** reading books many years ago (commence a leer libros hace muchos años)

En cambio los verbos irregulares cambian su forma, y tenemos que buscarlos en la tabla de verbos irregulares en el diccionario.

Be- **was/were**

Take-**took**

Ej.: I'm a teacher now (Ahora soy profesora)

I **was** a student many years ago (Era estudiante hace muchos años)

I take a shower at night, every day (Me ducho a la noche todos los dias)


Last Monday, I **took** a shower in the morning.(El lunes pasado, me duché a la mañana)

Surviving the storm - a true story



In 1985, Joe Simpson and Simon Yates started their dangerous climb up Siula Grande, a very tall mountain in Peru. After three days they reached the top, but they didn't have much food left. They needed to go down quickly!

Then disaster happened! Simpson fell and broke his leg. The two men tied themselves together with a long rope, and continued down the mountain, very slowly. But that wasn't the end of their problems. During a snowstorm, Simpson fell off the edge of the mountain. He was hanging from the rope, and Yates was starting to fall too! They shouted but they didn't hear or see each other. Yates held the rope for an hour, but then he had to make a very difficult decision. He didn't want to die, and he thought that his friend was dead. He cut the rope and continued down the mountain alone.

Simpson wasn't dead. He fell 30 meters and landed in an ice cave. It was cold and dark. He didn't have any food or water, and he had a broken leg. He desperately wanted to live! He climbed out of the cave and very slowly began to crawl down the mountain. Finally, three days later, he reached the camp. Simpson and Yates were both safe!

Simpson wrote a book called *Touching the Void* about his experience. In 2003, a movie about this amazing story of survival won awards in the U.K. and the U.S.
